

Learning Objectives

Families are better served when services provided by different entities are congruent in approach and regard for families. (e.g. strength based, trauma informed)







In 2018, DCFS answered 52,867 calls of child abuse or neglect to its statewide, toll-free, 24/7 hotline



- 2,330 foster families




Professional Development
