Families Served Through the Maternal, Infant, and Early Childhood Home Visiting Program in 2021

Evidence-based models implemented with MIECHV funds in Arkansas included Healthy Families America, Home Instruction for Parents of Preschool Youngsters, Nurse-Family Partnership, Parents as Teachers, and Following Baby Back Home. Statewide, MIECHV funded 77 full-time equivalent (FTE) home visitors and 15 FTE supervisors. FTE can include full-time and part-time staff.
