### **Early Steps to School Success**

<u>Early Steps to School Success</u> (ESSS) builds strong foundations for parenting and school readiness in communities with limited resources. The model aims to help provide children with the skills necessary for success in school; empower parents with the knowledge and skills to support their children's education; strengthen the connection between the home, school, and community; and significantly increase early childhood knowledge and skills in communities.

# What is the model's approach to providing home visiting services?

Home visits take place twice a month until a child is 3 years old. ESSS recommends that families begin services prenatally, but they can enroll any time before the child is 2 years old.

ESSS' service population includes the following:

Expectant caregivers

Families with low incomes

First-time caregivers

Caregivers under 21 years old

Caregivers with limited access to education

## Who is implementing the model?


#### **Home Visitors**

ESSS was implemented by 143 home visitors in 2021. The model requires a high school diploma or GED and experience working with families and children for home visitors; an associate's or bachelor's degree and experience in home visiting and child health and/or development are recommended. Home visitors are required to maintain a caseload of 20 children.

#### **Supervisors**

ESSS was implemented by 20 supervisors in 2021. The model requires a bachelor's degree and experience in early education, child health and/or development, home visiting, staff supervision, and working with families and children for supervisors; a master's degree is recommended.

# Where is the model implemented?




ESSS operated in 118 local agencies across 9 states in 2021.
