

Models implemented in New Mexico included Early Head Start Home-Based Option, Family Spirit, Nurse-Family Partnership, and Parents as Teachers. Statewide, 43 local agencies operated at least one of these models.

In New Mexico, there were 110,600 pregnant women and families with children under 6 years old not yet in kindergarten who could benefit from home visiting. These families included 144,500 children.
