## Families Served Through the Maternal, Infant, and Early Childhood Home Visiting Program in 2021

Evidence-based models implemented with MIECHV funds in Texas included Healthy Families America, Home Instruction for Parents of Preschool Youngsters, Nurse-Family Partnership, and Parents as Teachers. Statewide, MIECHV funded 193 full-time equivalent (FTE) home visitors and 40 FTE supervisors. FTE can include full-time and part-time staff.
