Families Served Through the Maternal, Infant, and Early Childhood Home Visiting Program in 2021

Models implemented with Tribal MIECHV funds included Family Spirit, Nurse-Family Partnership, Parents as Teachers, and Parent-Child Assistance Program. Nationwide, Tribal MIECHV funded 76 full-time equivalent (FTE) home visitors and 36 FTE supervisors. FTE can include full-time and part-time staff.

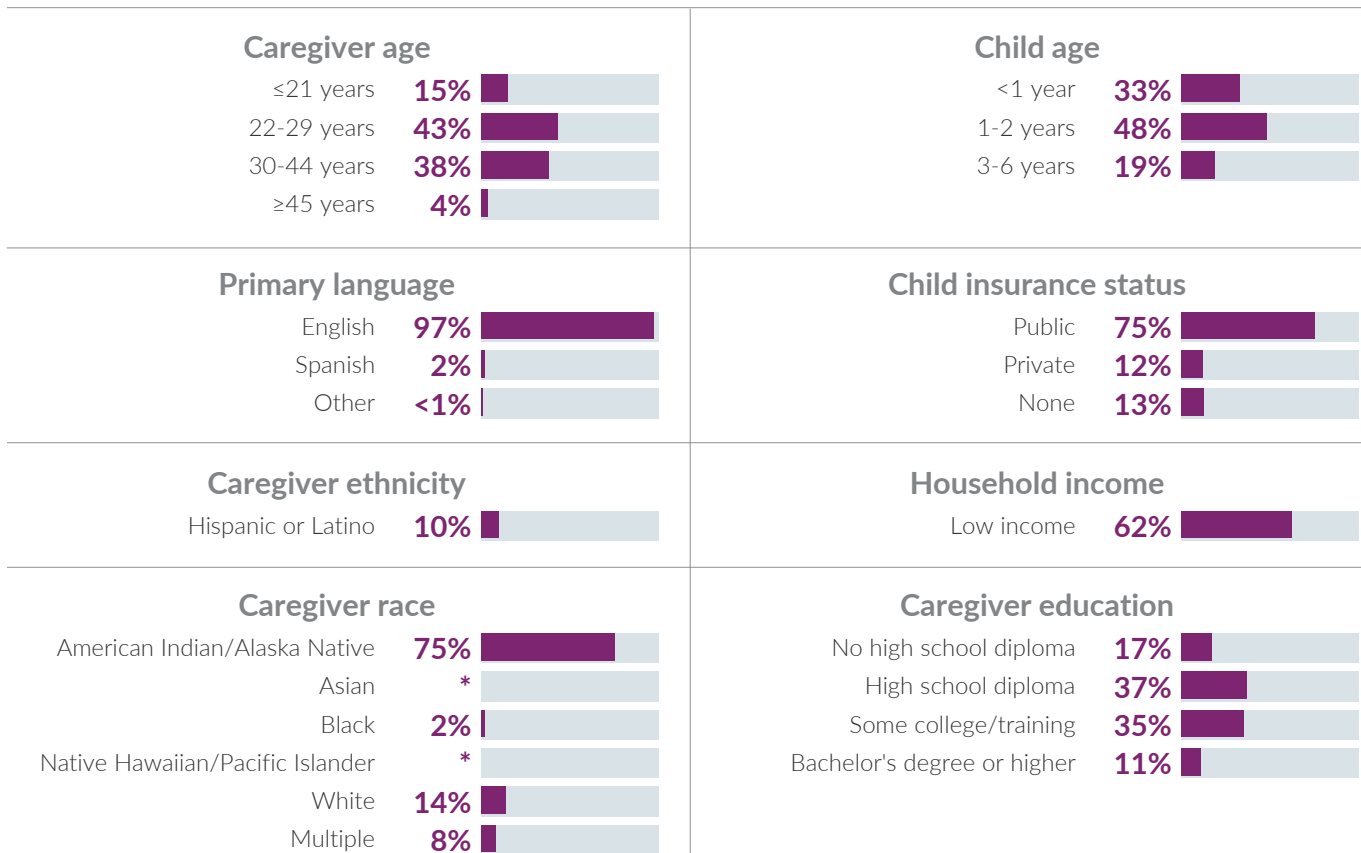

Data in this profile were provided by the Administration for Children and Families Tribal Home Visiting Program. • Grantees reported some data for new enrollees only. • Caregivers and children with missing data were excluded from the calculations. • Public insurance includes Medicaid, CHIP, and TRICARE. • Low income is defined as family income at or below 100 percent of the federal poverty guidelines. • Counts of FTE home visitor and supervisor positions were rounded to the nearest whole number. • To protect confidentiality, race and ethnicity categories with 10 or fewer participants were replaced with *. • Percentages may not add to 100 due to rounding. • Data include service numbers for Parent-Child Assistance Program, which is recognized by HRSA as a promising approach.
