

Families Served Through Evidence-Based Home Visiting in 2022

Models implemented in Arizona included Early Head Start Home-Based Option, Family Spirit, Healthy Families America, Nurse-Family Partnership, and Parents as Teachers. Statewide, 78 local agencies operated at least one of these models.

In Arizona, there were 386,500 pregnant women and families with children under 6 years old not yet in kindergarten who could benefit from home visiting. These families included 480,900 children.
