









Health Access Nurturing Development Services

[Health Access Nurturing Development Services](#) (HANDS) is a statewide home visiting program in Kentucky that provides assistance to overburdened parents during the prenatal period until their child is 3 years old. The model's main goals are to promote healthy pregnancies and births, optimal child growth and development, safe homes, and family self-sufficiency.

<p>What is the model's approach to providing home visiting services?</p>	<p>Home visits take place weekly, beginning prenatally, until the child is 6 months old. After the child is 6 months old, visit frequency is determined by the family's level of need. Services are offered until the child is 3 years old. HANDS requires families to initiate services prenatally or before the child is 3 months old.</p> <p>HANDS' service population includes the following:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none">  Families experiencing low incomes, unstable housing, or unemployment  Caregivers who are unmarried or single  Caregivers with limited access to education  Families with a history of substance or tobacco use  Families facing challenges such as marital concerns or inadequate social networks  Caregivers with delayed or no prenatal care or history of abortion  Families experiencing mental health concerns
<p>Who is implementing the model?</p>	<p>Home Visitors</p> <p>HANDS was implemented by 241 full-time equivalent (FTE) home visitors in 2022. Paraprofessional home visitors must have a high school diploma. Professional home visitors must have a bachelor's or associate's degree in a related field or be a registered nurse or social worker. Home visitor caseloads are weighted based on families' needs; home visitors are expected to maintain an average weighted caseload of 38 to 40 families.</p> <p>Supervisors</p> <p>HANDS was implemented by 54 FTE supervisors in 2022. The model requires supervisors to be an advanced registered nurse practitioner, registered nurse, or licensed social worker.</p>

<p>Where is the model implemented?</p>	<div style="display: flex; align-items: center;">  <div> <p>HANDS operated in 57 local agencies in 1 state in 2022.</p> </div> </div>

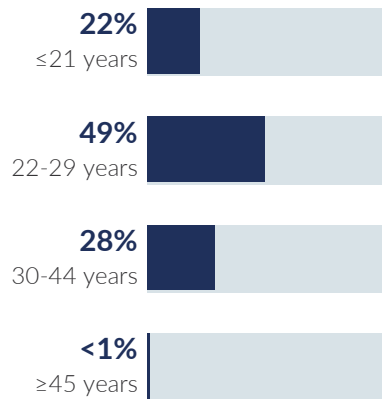

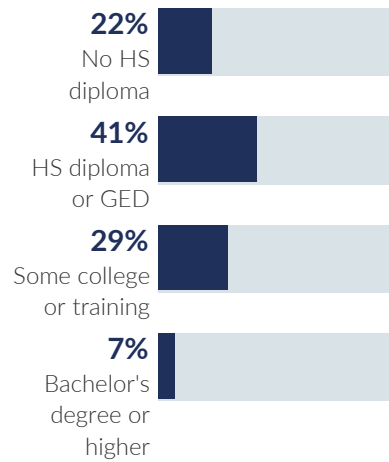

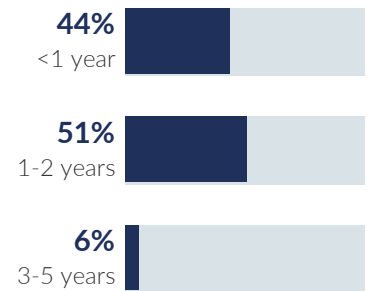
Caregiver age



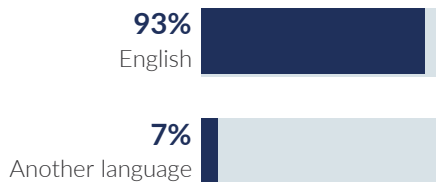
Caregiver education



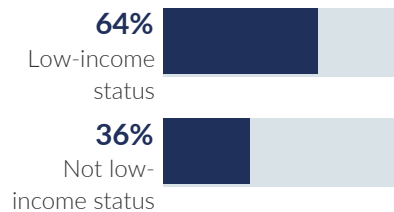
Child age



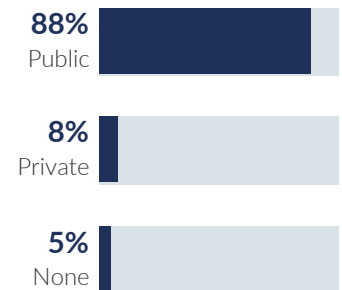
Primary language
