Evidence-based models implemented with MIECHV funds in Massachusetts included Early Head Start Home-Based Option, Healthy Families America, and Parents as Teachers. Statewide, MIECHV funded 48 full-time equivalent (FTE) home visitors and 10 FTE supervisors. FTE can include full-time and part-time staff.
