Families Served Through the Maternal, Infant, and Early Childhood Home Visiting Program in 2023

Evidence-based models implemented with MIECHV funds in Kansas included Early Head Start Home-Based Option, Healthy Families America, Parents as Teachers, and Team for Infants Exposed to Substance use Program. Statewide, MIECHV funded 25 full-time equivalent (FTE) home visitors and 5 FTE supervisors. FTE can include full-time and part-time staff.
