

Louisiana

Families Served Through Evidence-Based Home Visiting in 2023

Models implemented in Louisiana included Child First, Early Head Start Home-Based Option, Family Connects, Home Instruction for Parents of Preschool Youngsters, Nurse-Family Partnership, and Parents as Teachers. Statewide, 30 local agencies operated at least one of these models.

Potential Beneficiaries in 2023

In Louisiana, there were 251,700 pregnant women and families with children under 6 years old not yet in kindergarten who could benefit from home visiting. These families included 335,500 children.
