Evidence-based models implemented with MIECHV funds in North Dakota included Nurse-Family Partnership and Parents as Teachers. Statewide, MIECHV funded 7 full-time equivalent (FTE) home visitors and 2 FTE supervisors. FTE can include full-time and part-time staff.
