Evidence-based models implemented with MIECHV funds in Pennsylvania included Child First, Early Head Start Home-Based Option, Family Check-Up, Family Connects, Healthy Families America, Nurse-Family Partnership, Parents as Teachers, and SafeCare Augmented. Statewide, MIECHV funded 76 full-time equivalent (FTE) home visitors and 22 FTE supervisors. FTE can include full-time and part-time staff.
