About the 2025 Home Visiting Yearbook

The [2025 Home Visiting Yearbook](#) presents the landscape of early childhood home visiting across America. It features updated information from robust data sources, including 17 evidence-based home visiting models and 12 emerging models. The yearbook includes data from 2024, when the field continued to offer a mix of virtual and in-person service delivery.

Highlights

- Evidence-based home visiting was implemented in all 50 states, the District of Columbia, 5 territories, 32 Indigenous communities, and 52 percent of U.S. counties in 2024.
- More than 284,000 families received evidence-based home visiting services in 2024, over the course of more than 3 million home visits. Approximately 14 percent of these visits were provided virtually, down from nearly 23 percent the prior year, reflecting a continued return to in-person visits.
- Over 70,000 additional families received home visiting services through 11 emerging models that provided more than 625,000 home visits in 2024.
- More than 20,000 home visitors and supervisors delivered evidence-based services in 2024.
- More than 16.9 million pregnant women and families (including over 22 million children) could benefit from home visiting. Of those, approximately 284,000 received services in 2024—only 1.7 percent of all potential beneficiaries or 3.6 percent of high-priority families.
- This year's publication is dedicated to Dr. Deborah Daro, a founding member of the NHVRC Advisory Committee and a lifelong champion of families. For more than four decades, Dr. Daro helped shape the field of home visiting through research, policy, and advocacy—including her pivotal role in developing the federal Maternal, Infant, and Early Childhood Home Visiting (MIECHV) Program. Her insights and leadership helped guide the yearbook's content and direction from its inception. We honor her legacy and enduring impact on the field.
