EHS provides individualized services to pregnant women, infants, and toddlers to promote the school readiness of young children from low-income families. The model is administered by the Office of Head Start in the U.S. Department of Health and Human Services' Administration for Children and Families. EHS promotes the school readiness of low-income children from birth to 3 years old by enhancing their cognitive, social, and emotional development. Who is implementing the model?	 Home Visitors EHS was implemented by 5,969 home visitors in 2018. The model requires a home-based Child Development Associate (CDA) credential, comparable credential, or equivalent coursework as part of an associate's or bachelor's degree. Home visitors are required to maintain an average caseload of 10 to 12 families. Supervisors EHS was implemented by 1,256 supervisors in 2018. The model requires a bachelor's or other advanced degree with coursework in early childhood education and early education experience for supervisors. 	
Where is the model implemented?		EHS operated in 816 local agencies across 50 states and the District of Columbia, Guam, the Northern Mariana Islands, Palau, Puerto Rico, and the U.S. Virgin Islands in 2018.

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
Early Head Start Home-Based Option
